The winery's first vintage in 1972 included a dry style Fumé Blanc that helped to pave the way for a rebirth of the Dry Creek Valley appellation. Winery founder David Stare was the first person to plant the Sauvignon Blanc varietal in the Dry Creek Valley and spent the majority of his career talking about the delicious attributes of this incredible variety. Today, his daughter Kim Stare Wallace has elevated the winery's Sauvignon Blanc program to new heights. Winemaker Tim Bell continues to innovate using new and exciting clonal selections from a diverse array of Dry Creek Valley


vineyards. As the flagship variety at Dry Creek Vineyard, the future of Sauvignon Blanc has never been brighter.

FLAVOR PROFILE

WHITE PEACH, MANGO AND FRESH CITRUS WITH RACY MINERAL TONES

THE USE OF DIFFERENT CLONES to produce our delicious Sauvignon Blanc is one of the biggest factors in gaining the distinct flavor profile that makes this wine stand apart. Produced from 100% Dry Creek Valley grapes, the warm climate of our home appellation also plays a vital role. With Sauvignon Blanc Clone 1 and 21, we see characters that are more grassy and citrus driven. With Clone 30, the Sauvignon Musqué shines with ripe white stone fruit notes and a full-bodied mouthfeel. Finally, with Clone 917, the Sauvignon Gris provides a steely mineral aroma and rich viscosity. Blended together, the wine achieves layers of richness and texture making it an extraordinary palate experience from start to finish.



CLONE I IS KNOWN AS THE "WENTE CLONE." IT WAS PLANTED IN THE LIVERMORE AREA IN THE 1880s. BUT IT ORIGINALLY CAME FROM CHATEAU D'YOUEM IN BORDEAUX, FRANCE,

CLONE 21 IS ALSO KNOWN AS THE FRENCH CLONE 378. IT IS SEEN AS A HIGHLY PRODUCTIVE CLONE WITH SUPERIOR FERTILITY AND CONCENTRATION OF FRUIT PROVIDES WONDERFUL FRESH FRUIT NOTES



CLONE 30 IS A CALIFORNIA FIELD SELECTION OF A MUSQUÉ-TYPE SAUVIGNON BLANC, CLONE 30 TENDS TO RIPEN AT A HIGHER SUGAR IN COOLER CLIMATES PROVIDING AN EXPANSIVE PALATE EXPERIENCE.

KNOWN AS FRENCH CLONE 917. THIS CLONE IS USED BY WELL REGARDED BORDEAUX PRODUCER CHATEAU HAUT-BRION TO PRODUCE WONDERFULLY AROMATIC DRY WHITE WINES. CLONE 917 EMANATES A VERY UNUSUAL PINKISH, GREY COLOR AT HARVEST
