

A History of Firsts


eing the first to do something - anything really - can place a high degree of responsibility in the hands of the person or people in charge of shepherding the historic nature of the "first". Think about it. The first person to walk on the moon was Neil Armstrong. In July of 1969, Armstrong set foot on the lunar surface and declared this was "one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind". Talk about a memorable and historic first! In the world of wine, there have been all kinds of historic firsts. The first grapevines in the United States were planted in New Mexico in 1629. In California, the first vineyard and winery was established by Spanish missionaries in 1769. Agoston Haraszthy came along in 1857 and is known as the "Father of Modern Viticulture in California". He spawned the careers of such luminaries as Charles Krug, Karl Wente, Charles Wetmore, Jacob Beringer and yes, David Stare.

Those early pioneers paved the way for Dry Creek Vineyard's David Stare to come along and revitalize our far Northern Sonoma County appellation. Founded in 1972, our winery has been fortunate to stand on the shoulders of some of the giants in our industry and carve out a unique niche as one of California's new pioneers. We are proud of our more than 40 year legacy.

Perhaps the winery and Dave's greatest achievement was bringing the Sauvignon Blanc varietal to the Dry Creek Valley. Against the better advice of everyone around him, Dave planted Sauvignon Blanc with a vision and passion to make wines that emulated those of the Loire Valley in France. His drive and dedication to Sauvignon Blanc is still felt today - both at the winery and in the Dry Creek Valley appellation. Our Fumé Blanc and Sauvignon Blanc continue to be our best selling wines and Sauvignon Blanc is now the most widely planted white varietal in the Dry Creek Valley. The list of our historic firsts is a source of pride both within the winery and also for our loyal customers who have purchased our wines for many years.







- 1973 1st to advocate Bordeaux blending
- 1982 1st sailboat on a wine label
- 1983 1st to pioneer Dry Creek Valley's AVA status
- 1985 1st to coin the term Old Vine Zinfandel
- 1987 1st to adopt the term Meritage on a wine label
- 1997 1st to release a Heritage Clone Zinfandel
- 1998 1st to introduce sustainable agriculture in California
- 2002 1st to partner with US SAILING
- 2013 1st Official Wine for Sailors
- 2015 1st Class Winery


