DRY CREEK VALLEY TERROIR AND CABERNET SAUVIGNON

Endeavour Vineyard began with the vision of the second-generation winery owners, Kim Stare Wallace and her husband Don, to create exceptional wines that define their varietal character and reflect the unique *terroir* of the Dry Creek Valley. In the mid-1990s, Don searched for nearly five years to find the perfect location to plant Cabernet Sauvignon in pursuit of this dream. Using an airplane and topographic maps, Don zeroed in on the Lytton Springs area as a possible location for a new vineyard. The combination of excellent soil conditions, drainage and sun exposure of this particular parcel was ideal.

Using topographic maps and soil quality analysis, Don was able to determine which parts of the vineyard had low versus high soil fertility. Instead of planting with the traditional method of evenly-spaced rows, he used this soil analysis to adjust the row spacing, planting each vine in an ideal spot for nutrients. The result is a completely sustainable vineyard — able to maintain and moderate yields on its own — that produces exceptionally flavorful and balanced fruit.

OUR PHILOSOPHY SUSTAINABLE WINEGROWING

Endeavour is a sustainable vineyard ecosystem, with amphitheater-style topography which allows for rain water sheet flow. This sloping terrain creates a natural pond that provides the vineyard its own water source. This essential component is the backbone of the closed loop system that makes Endeavour so special. During the rainy months, water is collected in the pond. This water helps irrigate the vines as they grow, and the vines then transpire the water, releasing it to the atmosphere before returning later as rainfall.
