SeaQuelle is a refined and expressive Meritage that places Merlot center stage, crafted in the spirit of the great Right Bank blends of Bordeaux, France. The Garonne River flows thorough the Right Bank of the Bordeaux region, and this area is known for its softer, Merlot-based wines. As the newest addition to our Bordeaux-inspired portfolio, SeaQuelle embodies the next generation of vision at Dry Creek Vineyard, building on a five-decade tradition of Bordeaux-style blending. Crafted with all five noble red Bordeaux varieties, and sourced from meticulously farmed hillside vineyards throughout Dry Creek Valley, SeaQuelle is a wine of balance, finesse, and depth. It is a supple, elegant counterpart to our Cabernet Sauvignon-based blend, The Mariner.
